Core Idea

I hear Koreans say 와 all the time. Is it just English “wow,” or are there different versions?

좋은 질문이에요. 와, 우와, 이야 are short delight sounds. They show surprise, admiration, or happy amazement.

오늘의 핵심은 번역보다 느낌이에요. The feeling matters more than one perfect English word.

First, 와. It is the clean, all-purpose reaction. Like “wow,” but very common in daily Korean.

Conversation Snapshot

Speaker	Korean	Meaning
Hana	와, 냄새 좋다. —	Wow, it smells good.
Junho	우와, 양이 많네요. —	Ooh wow, there's a lot.
Hana	이야, 국물 맛있다. —	Whoa, the broth is delicious.



Speaker	Korean	Meaning
Junho	와, 가격도 괜찮아요. —	Wow, the price is good too.

Vocabulary & Useful Expressions

Word	Meaning	Example
와 / 우와 / 이야 wa / uwa / iya	wow / ooh wow / whoa, nice	좋은 질문이에요. 와, 우와, 이야 are short delight sounds. They show surprise, admiration, or happy amazement.
감탄사 gamtansa	interjection, reaction sound	오늘의 핵심은 번역보다 느낌이에요. The feeling matters more than one perfect English word.
와 wa	wow	First, 와. It is the clean, all-purpose reaction. Like “wow,” but very common in daily Korean.
우와 uwa	ooh wow, wowwww	Next, 우와. It feels a little bigger, more excited, or more openly delighted than 와.
와 → 우와 wa → uwa	wow → ooh wow	맞아요. If 와 is a quick “wow,” 우와 is like “ooh, wow.”
이야 iya	whoa, wow, nice	Now 이야. 이야 often sounds impressed, satisfied, or admiring. It can feel like “whoa,” “wow,” or “nice.”
이야, 좋다 iya, jota	Wow, this is nice	Exactly. 이야 can sound slightly older or more hearty depending on voice, but it is very natural.
일상적인 말 ilsangjeogin mal	everyday speech	One more important point: these are casual spoken reactions. Use them with friends, family, shops, cafes, and daily life.

와 / 우와 / 이야 — wow / ooh wow / whoa, nice

Short reactions for pleasant surprise or admiration

감탄사

감탄사 — interjection, reaction sound

A tiny word that reacts to what you see, hear, taste, or discover

와

와 — wow

The safest everyday amazement sound

와, 맛있겠다.

와, + 맛있 + 겠다. — Wow, that looks delicious.

와 can react to food, a view, a price, a cute item, or good news. It is short and flexible.

와, 맛있겠다.

와, + 맛있 + 겠다. — Wow, that looks delicious.

와, 맛있겠다. In English, “Wow, that looks delicious.” The ending 겠다 here guesses from what you see.

우와, 예쁘다.	uwa, yeppeuda.
와, 정말 맛있어요.	wa, jeongmal masisseoyo.
와, 냄새 좋다.	wa, naemsae jota.
와, 냄새 좋아요.	wa, naemsae joayo.
우와, 예뻐요.	uwa, yeppeoyo.
이야, 야경 좋다.	iya, yagyeong jota.
