Core Idea

Here's my real fear: I'm on a Korean bus, my stop is coming, and I freeze. Do I say stop? 여기? 다음? What actually sounds natural?

좋은 질문이에요. In Korea, you often press the stop button first, but if you need to speak, short and polite is best.

Today's two key phrases are 다음이요 and 여기서 내려 주세요. One means next, please. The other means please let me get off here.

So the goal is not a full speech. It's more like a survival button for my mouth.

Hana	다음이요. —	Next, please.



Speaker	Korean	Meaning
Junho	네, 다음 정류장에서 세울게요. —	Okay, I'll stop at the next bus stop.
Hana	감사합니다. —	Thank you.

Vocabulary & Useful Expressions

Word	Meaning	Example
다음이요 / 여기서 내려 주세요 daeumiyo / yeogiseo naeryeo juseyo	Next, please / Please let me get off here	Today's two key phrases are 다음이요 and 여기서 내려 주세요. One means next, please. The other means please let me get off here.
장소에서 내려 주세요 jangsoeseo naeryeo juseyo	Please let me get off at a place	맞아요. 오늘의 패턴은 장소에서 내려 주세요예요. In English, please let me get off at a place.
다음이요 daeumiyo	Next, please	And the shortest version for the next stop is 다음이요. It is very common, especially when the meaning is obvious in the bus.
다음 정류장에서 내려 주세요 daeum jeongnyujangeseo naeryeo juseyo	Please let me get off at the next bus stop	다음 정류장에서 내려 주세요. 정류장은 bus stop. Here, 에서 marks the place where the action happens: at the bus stop. 내려 주세요 means please let me get off, or please stop so I can get off.
여기서 내려 주세요 yeogiseo naeryeo juseyo	Please let me get off here	여기서 내려 주세요. This means please let me get off here. 여기서 is here, at this place.
내려 주세요 naeryeo juseyo	Please let me get off	Good catch. 내리다 means to get off or get down. 내려 주세요 is a polite request: please let me get off, or please stop so I can get off.
‘여기서’는 말할 때 자연스러워요 yeogiseoneun malhal ttae jayeonseureowoyo	여기서 is natural in speech.	‘여기서’는 ‘여기에서’를 줄인 말이에요. In English, here, at this place. 여기서 is very common in speech.
여기에서 → 여기서 yeogiese → yeogiseo	at here → here / at this place	So 여기에서 내려 주세요 is okay, but 여기서 내려 주세요 is what I should expect to hear and say.

Useful on buses, village buses, and taxis in casual service situations

장소에서 내려 주세요

장소에서 내려 주세요 — Please let me get off at a place

장소 = place

다음이요

다음이요 — Next, please

Short request when the next stop is your stop

다음 정류장에서 내려 주세요

다음 정류장 + 에서 + 내려 + 주세요 — Please let me get off at the next bus stop

다음 정류장에서 내려 주세요. 정류장은 bus stop. Here, 에서 marks the place where the action happens: at the bus stop. 내려 주세요 means please let me get off, or please stop so I can get off.

여기서 내려 주세요

여기 + 서 + 내려 + 주세요 — Please let me get off here

여기서 내려 주세요. This means please let me get off here. 여기서 is here, at this place.
