## Core Idea

Okay, real question. When I hear 사다 and 서다, honestly they sound almost the same to me. Am I broken?

You're not broken. In English we lump a bunch of vowels into one lazy 'uh', so our ears never had to split these.

이건 아주 흔한 실수예요. This is a very common mistake. 사다 means 'to buy,' 서다 means 'to stand.' Same word shape, different vowel.

So the vowel is not decoration. 오늘은 이 두 소리만 기억하세요 — today, remember just these two sounds.

ㅏ vs ㅑ a vs eo	two open vowels, two meanings	So the vowel is not decoration. 오늘은 이 두 소리만 기억하세요 — today, remember just these two sounds.
아 a	The Two Open Vowels Beginners Blur	먼저 ㅏ예요. First, ㅏ. Drop your jaw and open wide — it's the 'a' in 'father.' 아.
어 eo	The Two Open Vowels Beginners Blur	이제 ㅑ예요. Now ㅑ. Jaw is more relaxed, mouth a little less open — it's the 'u' in 'sun.' 어.
아 ↔ 어 a ↔ eo	The Two Open Vowels Beginners Blur	핵심은 턱이에요 — the key is your jaw. 아 is wide open, 어 is half open. 아... 어. Feel the drop change.
아 = wide a = wide open	어 = half open, relaxed	So it's a jaw thing, not a tongue thing. Big open mouth for 아, chill half-open for 어.
사다 sada	to buy	예문을 볼게요. Let's see real examples. 사다 — 'to buy.' Wide jaw on the first syllable: 사.
서다 seoda	to stand	그리고 서다 — 'to stand.' Half-open, relaxed jaw: 서. 사다... 서다.

사다 / 서다 — to buy / to stand

Only the vowel changes: ㅏ vs ㅑ

#### ㅏ vs ㅑ

ㅏ vs ㅑ — two open vowels, two meanings

The vowel carries the meaning

#### ㅏ = wide

ㅏ = wide — ㅑ = half open, relaxed

Let your jaw do the work

#### 사다

ㅏ + 다 — to buy

예문을 볼게요. Let's see real examples. 사다 — 'to buy.' Wide jaw on the first syllable: ㅏ.

#### 서다

ㅑ + 다 — to stand

그리고 서다 — 'to stand.' Half-open, relaxed jaw: ㅑ. 사다... 서다.
